# Gift Wrapping Checklist

$\square$ Gift Wrapping
$\square$ Gather your materials.
$\square$ Lay the materials out on a flat work surface.
$\square$ Don't limit yourself to just one pattern per present.
$\square$ For large gifts, consider layering two or more papers of different colors or patterns.
$\square$ Wrap a long piece of ribbon around the gift box lengthwise.
$\square$ If you have a card, slide it under the ribbon and secure it with tape.
$\square$ To make the actual present a surprise, wrap a toy or model-size version of it.
$\square$ Attach a note that gives clues to the location of the real thing.
$\square$ Package small presents with a twist by wrapping them to look like candy canes.
$\square$ Gift Wrapping Alternatives
$\square$ Fabric gift bags make beautiful, personal and unique gift wraps.
$\square$ Use large sheets of color comics for wrapping kids' gifts.
$\square$ Cut out the pictures from large size calendar and use them for gift wrap.
$\square$ Use wallpaper samples from your local paint and wallpaper shop.
$\square$ An appealling source for gift wrap are old maps.
