	Make sure that PC that you buy has a decent amount of RAM memory
	If broadband Internet is not available in your area, make sure your computer includes a modem.
	If you purchase a brand-name computer, find out if the company has a website that provides software device driver updates for its computers
	Look into any terms and conditions that might apply to the use of the service.
	Before purchasing an extended warranty, obtain a copy and read the small print.
	Weigh up the cost of an extended warranty against the likely cost of having repairs done by a third party.
	Find out what kind of after-sales support is provided.
	Look out for hidden costs.
	Check the return policy.
