

Vow Renewal Checklist

- Planning the Ceremony
 - Decide when to host the vow renewal.
 - Pick a place that is meaningful to the two of you.
 - Get a copy of your vows.
 - If possible, find the priest, rabbi, clergyman, or other officiant who married you the first time.
 - Decide if you want to invite guests.
 - Celebrate - either the two of you or with family and friends.
- Vow Renewal Etiquette
 - Do not organize bachelor/bachelorette parties.
 - Encourage friends and family to shower you with love and support, rather than gifts.
 - Vow Renewal is generally not viewed as a gift-giving situation.
 - Parents should not be involved in the finances of vow renewal ceremony.
 - Incorporate some of the traditions from your wedding day, but make new ones as well.
 - You may use your original attendants but, it is better to simply invite them as guests.
 - The father doesn't need to publicly show his approval or support of the marriage.
 - Put together your bouquet with care and consideration.
 - All of your guests should be acquainted with you.
 - You can still dance a couple's first dance.
 - Choose for 'anniversary' type cake.
 - The toasts should reflect upon the couple's continued love.
