Practical Steps	
	Make an inventory of your major assets.

	Work out each spouse's individual living costs.
	Address your retirement benefits.
	Prepare a budget to cover children maintenance.
	Consider whether either of you has any hidden or contingent assets.
	Evaluate your wills and any estate planning.
	Budget for any legal fees that may be required in implementing your separation.
	Consider what professional advice you will require.
