		Maintain professionalism during the termination process.
		Ask your employer when you will receive your final paycheck.

		Start looking for another job.
	Personal	
		Talk to your family and keep a positive attitude.
		Find out where to go for help.
		Look at housing alternatives.
		Apply for energy assistance programs and find alternative energy sources.
		Look for employment programs and services.
		Make sure your resume is polished.
		Work your network, contacting everyone you know.
	Financial	
		Prepare a household budget to see where you spend your money and where you can save.
		Lower your monthly bills by negotiating with your vendors.
